RULES

BASIC RULES FOR EVENTS

SCOREKEEPING: Certified ADULT must do for 12 and Under. ADULT at table for 13s & 14s.

OFFICIATING: Coaches are R2 → WHISTLE REQUIRED (will have available to purchase)

AGE WAIVERS: Same grade level, and within 6 months of cutoff

QUALIFIERS: NO AGE WAIVERS ALLOWED, NO BID → ENTRY REFUND AWARD

PROTEST PROTOCOL: In game → before next point. Seeding → before bracket begins

TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR: Site Director who is the point of contact

State director (Dani) may not be contacted while coaching or officiating



RULE CHANGES

FOR THE 2025-26 SEASON

SCREENING - *To modify the language for the screening rule to prohibit players from raising their hands above the head during the service until the ball has passed beyond the net.*

DOUBLES - *To allow multiple contacts on a team's second hit if the ball is next contacted by a teammate.*


SUBSTITUTIONS - *Allow 15 team substitutions per set.*

LIBEROS - *To modify the rule on Libero designation to allow a team to designate zero, one, or two Liberos for each set.*

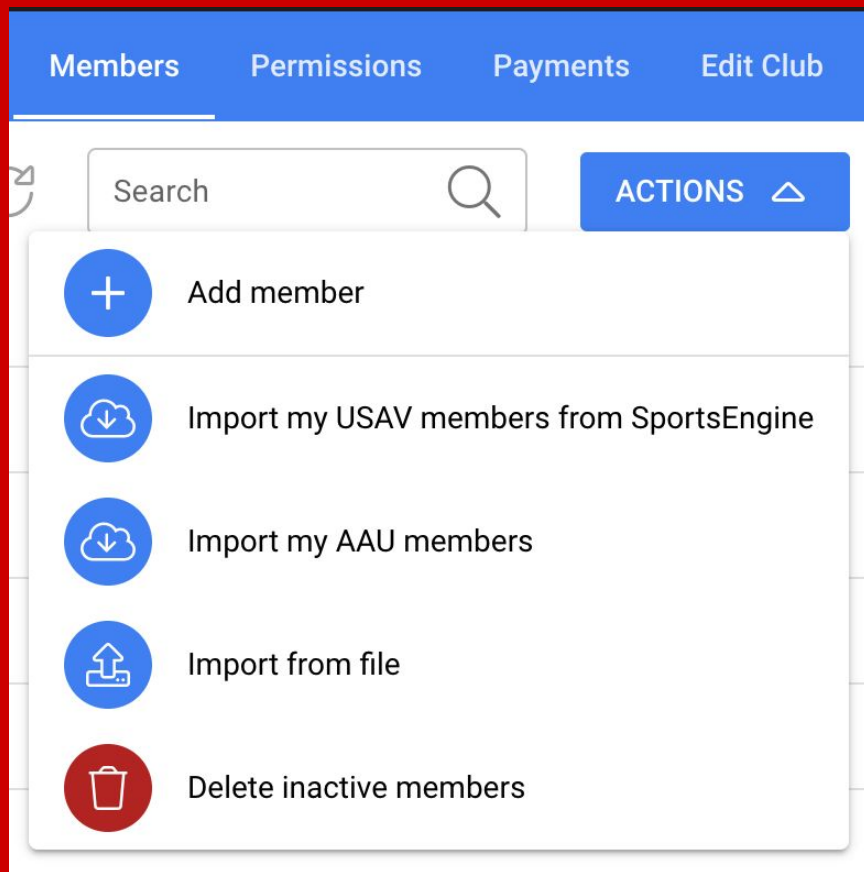

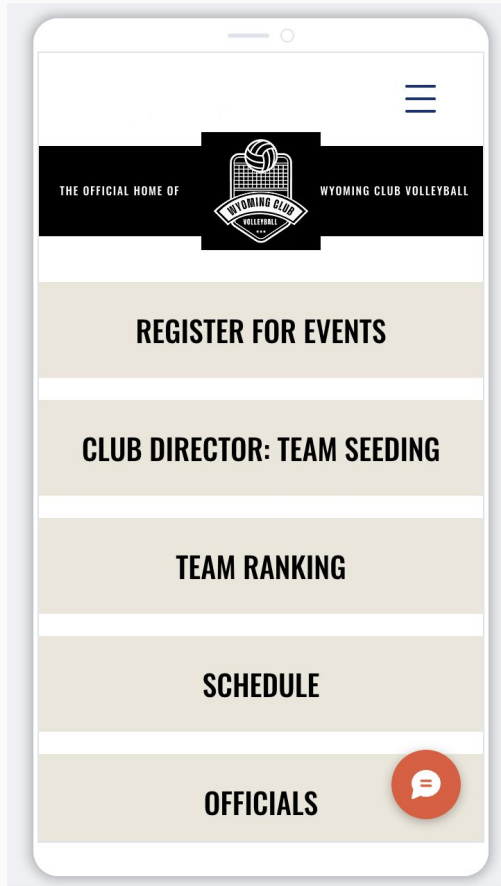

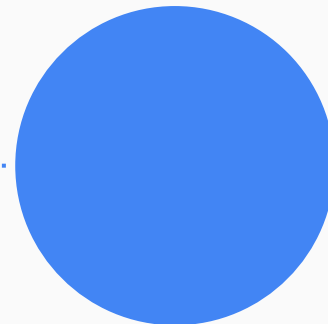
